During this time of on-line instruction, be assured that your library resources are available on line. The library website is located under the Parents & Students drop-down menu on the school website. A few of our databases have been moved and some of our offerings expanded; so please read on to find out what you can do within our library from the comfort of your home.



All INFOhio databases can be accessed by going through the school's website. Go to www.centralcatholicchs.org, Parents & Students, click library. Scroll down to the INFOhio box and click. If it prompts you for a user name and password, they are:

User: ccc-hs

Password ironmen

Click 9-12 to jump into the student and adult resources. See what INFOhio has to offer you.



Believe it or not we have the same resources that any Ohio Means Jobs office has! In addition, this button is the same place you would go to for school help and test prep for your students, as well as practice for the civil service exam and the ASVAB test for the armed services.

Electronic Books Fiction and Non-fiction

E-books are now available directly from our website. Once on our site, scroll down to Overdrive and the little rocket-man. Select our school, use your CCC Google ID and password to get in. (You might have to bribe your student for his or her credentials.) You can browse and check out books. They will automatically be returned when they are due.

Gale eBooks: Go to our library website. Scroll down to the Gale button and click. Choose Gale eBooks. Search for a book. Click on View ebook to read. If you don't actively search, you can still browse books and just click on the book to read. Use the Table of Contents button to see chapters and skip from place to place in the book.

Last but not least, when you are in SORA, (the rocket-man), you can add books from the Cleveland Public Library. Overdrive has an arrangement with CPL for us that opens up over 100,000 e-books to read at no charge. Click on the three little lines in the upper right-hand corner of the page; select add library; select CLEVNET. If you click on any book, you can read a summary of the book. If you'd like to read the first few chapters to see what the book is like, click read sample. When you are ready to borrow, click borrow. Books are automatically returned when due.

The award-winning Rosen Teen Health & Wellness has moved. It still provides middle and high school students with up-to-date, nonjudgmental, straightforward curricular, and self-help support. Topics covered include diseases, drugs, alcohol, nutrition, mental health, suicide, bullying, LGBTQ issues, and more. Get to Rosen by going to our library home page. It has its own button on the same page as InfOhio. User name is ccc-hs, password is ironmen.

There are also encyclopedias, access to EBSCO host for research, Chilton's for auto repair and more! INFOhio is paid for through our Ohio state taxes. It is there for everyone in Ohio to use.
